Who Owns Copyright?

The Australian Copyright Council website contains much valuable information. It can be accessed at http://www.copyright.org.au/find-an-answer/ As well as asking and answering questions on their webpage there are Adobe Acrobat documents you can download.

The following extracts are sourced from INFORMATION SHEET G58 obtained from the Australian Copyright Council.

"Key points

- The creator of copyright material is not necessarily the copyright owner.
- Ownership of copyright is separate from ownership of the physical item: if you buy a picture, book, photograph or CD this does not give you rights to copy it.
- Creators of copyright works have moral rights in relation to what they create, although they may not be the copyright owner."

"The general rule—the "author" is usually the first owner of copyright

The general rule is that the "author" is the first owner of copyright if the work is a text work, music, a dramatic work, a computer program or an artistic work (such as a drawing).

For the purposes of copyright law, an "author" is a person who gives expression to the ideas or information in a work—for example, by writing an instruction manual, or drawing graphics, or writing a computer program. A person who contributes ideas or information or suggestions, but does not contribute to the expression of a work, is not an "author". For photographs, the author is the person who takes the photograph. The Copyright Act also provides for works of joint authorship, which are works produced by two or more authors in which the contribution of each author cannot be distinguished.

The general rule that the author is the first owner of copyright may not apply if:

- the author has signed a document which says that someone else will own copyright; or
- there has been no agreement about ownership of copyright, and
- the author was an employee (rather than a freelancer or volunteer) and created the work as part of his or her usual duties; or
- the work is a commissioned photograph, portrait or engraving; or
- the work was made by, or under the direction or control of, the Commonwealth Government, or a State or Territory government; or
- the work was first published by, or under the direction or control of, the Commonwealth Government, or a State or Territory government.

(Note however, that the special rules relating to government direction or control do **not** apply to local councils and may not necessarily apply to statutory bodies)."

While the most widely recognized form of spam is <u>e-mail spam</u>, the term is applied to similar abuses in other media: <u>instant messaging spam</u>, <u>Usenet newsgroup spam</u>, <u>Web search engine spam</u>, <u>spam in blogs</u>, <u>wiki spam</u>, <u>online classified ads</u> spam, <u>mobile phone messaging spam</u>, <u>Internet forum spam</u>, <u>junk fax transmissions</u>, <u>social networking</u> spam, television <u>advertising</u> and file sharing network spam."
