Well it's almost here, that is the Spring and the warm weather we all crave. So clean your camera and charge your batteries, make sure you are ready.

Our outdoor shoot was at Pelican and for August we were spoilt with a beautiful afternoon, sunny and almost balmy. A good turn out and after taking many photos we repaired to the Pelican RSL for our usual get together over coffee and a good chat about our photography.

Our clubhouse meeting was a review of our photos and a discussion of the various shooting or recording modes on the modern digital camera. Some of our members are really using their cameras as they were meant to be used but others are still reluctant to try or experiment. If you don't try you won't learn. So be bold, a simple way to improve is to set your camera to SCN mode. This is the SCENE mode and it is a series of preset settings covering everything from Beach, Sunset, Kids and Pets, Foliage or Macro and various Night settings and a number of other setting dependant on your make of camera, this is almost foolproof as the camera does the thinking for you. Check your manual or Google it up on the computer.

Our next outdoor shoot is Saturday September at the spectacular Hunter Valley Gardens. Check your email for Barry Keen's instructions and then just follow his whistle. It should be an excellent day out.

A number of members have bought cameras recently and then found them too complicated or not suitable for their needs. Salesmen in many of the retail outlets are "salesmen" and they should be giving you the right advice but sadly this is not always the case. If you are contemplating buying a new camera, talk to a member of your Digipals committee and we will try to help you choose a camera that is appropriate to your needs. We have access to most up to date camera reviews and we have contacts within the industry who can give us advice.

Our Picasa, Know your camera classes and Fred Schinkel's short courses are proving very popular so watch the notice board at the clubhouse or visit our Computerpals Website for course details. Book early to avoid disappointment.

Hello Folk,

Now that we have our new membership cards, I have been able to work with the new franchisee at Domayne Computers and have negotiated some exclusive, special benefits for our club members.

iTunes Help

In a recent edition we explored adding music through iTunes. If you add your own CD's or add tracks converted from records you have the music but not any artwork.

Remember when you purchase music through Apple or BigPond the artwork is automatically added.

Why do I Need Artwork?

It's really a matter of choice.

If you have no artwork on an iPad, iTouch or iPad you get a musical note. If you add artwork you see the album cover (see comparison on right). It's sometimes nice to add those finishing



touches. Remember the days when the record artwork was an instant way of recognising an album in the record shops like Rayfords.

What Size is The Artwork?

If you add artwork that is too small it may appear "pixelated" or below what you expect. My suggestion is add artwork from jpegs that are a **minimum 500x500 pixels** - bigger is better quality (especially on larger devices).

Where Do I Get The Artwork?

Artwork is everywhere on the web, all you need to do is search. The best and easiest place to find it is at;

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



How To Add Artwork You've Just Saved?



In iTunes select all the Everly Brothers song/s you want to add the album cover to.

With the songs highlighted, RIGHT CLICK on GET INFO.

Say YES to making multiple selection changes if you have more than one song.

Choose the Artwork tab.

Press ADD and then navigate to where you saved the artwork.

Click OK and artwork will appear for the songs selected. You can add or delete artwork using the same process at any time.
