Social Report


Saturday 11th saw 12 'brave' souls turn up for a tour of the old Maitland Gaol.


Participants gathered at the Blackbird (gaol) Cafe for the usual morning tea refreshments before embarking on what was sure to be an insightful and thought-

Windows Updates

There is an easy, free way to keep your computer running smoothly and safer. All you have to do is turn Windows Updates on, and you will get the latest security and other important updates from Microsoft automatically. Important updates provide significant benefits, such as improved security and reliability.

Setting up Windows Update is simple. If you already have automatic updating turned on, Windows Update in the Control panel will open and show your update status.

If it is not yet turned on, you will be guided through the steps to do so.

After that, all the latest security and performance improvements will be installed on your computer quickly and reliably.

When you turn on automatic updating, most updates will download and install without you having to lift a finger. But sometimes Windows Update will need your input during an installation. In this case, you'll see an alert in the notification area at the far right of the taskbar—be sure to click it. If you don't respond to a Windows Update alert, your PC might end up missing an important download.

Automatic updating is recommended — but if you choose not to, be sure to check for updates at least once a week.

Please Note: Windows XP support has ended. Support and updates for Windows XP ended on April 8, 2014.
