

These people are all volunteers who also teach classes at Computerpals. We ask that you take this into consideration when your phone call is not answered immediately.

#### Can you hear me?

If you receive a call and immediately hear the phrase "Can you hear me?" - hang up!

The phrase is used to coax you into saying "Yes!"

This word, if said in YOUR voice, is as good as gold for con artists.

The person on the other end will most likely be recording the call, and can now use the audio track of you saying "Yes!" to access your sensitive information.

But how? Well may you ask!

That simple three-letter word is used frequently by companies to confirm account changes, security settings and purchases, and now this sordid grub on the other end of the line has extensive access to your stuff.

To avoid these calls, be wary of unknown or unrecognisable numbers, ALWAYS keep your personal information private, and don't be afraid to question the legitimacy of the caller.

You may have the urge to harangue the caller with your indignation, but please resist the urge. At some stage you are going to say "YES" and that is all they need.

Hang up!

# New wave of Telstra technical support scams: Alert Priority High

Victims are contacted by callers pretending to be representatives from Telstra reporting some kind of problem. (One recent scam, for example, claims that the lights blinking in a particular pattern on a modem or router indicates an issue).

These callers may either request remote access to your computer and/or ask for credit card details in order to charge a fake support fee or fix a false payment processing issue

If you are contacted unexpectedly by someone claiming to be from Telstra and they either ask you to verify your payment details or claim that there is a problem with your internet connection – **hang up**. If unsure, verify their identity by contacting Telstra using the phone number printed on your bill, or use the contact details on <a href="https://www.telstra.com.au">https://www.telstra.com.au</a>.

These types of scams attempt to take advantage of a victim's lack of knowledge or anxiety around technical issues. Scammers may use overtly technical language or play on user's fears of malware or other security threats to gain remote access to the victim's computer or steal their credit card details.
