As is usual at the AGM, Membership and Tuition Fees were set for the forthcoming year. Membership Fees remain the same - \$25 per year with Joining Fee of \$5 for new members. The Early Bird Bonus for new members or renewal of membership has been extended to 31^{st} October. This Bonus entitles the member to **one** free class to the value of \$12.
