

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

March has been a big month for ComputerPals Newcastle. I am very proud of our club, we were nominated by Val Woodman for a 2012 NSW Seniors Week Achievement Award in Lifelong Learning. On Sunday 18 March Bruce Deitz and I jointly received the award at a ceremony at the City Recital Hall in Sydney (see Photo on left). The ceremony compere was Jean Kittson and The Hon. Andrew Constance MP, Minister for Ageing addressed the gathering.

There was 59 awards in total, of the 10 in Lifelong Learning only two were to organisations, that was our club and ComputerPals Parramatta. Most of our committee and Group organisers were able to come along and we had a great day which was topped off with a backstage tour of the Recital Hall by Carolyn Keane's niece who is Technical Manager of the venue. You can see the award in the clubroom.

On Monday 19 March we had our combined Members Morning Tea and Seniors Week event. This was an outstanding success. Dr Ferdi Miteff gave a most interesting and informative talk on stroke and the improvements in treatment to a full hall of members and visitors. A most generous gesture. Visitors came in response to our advertisement and article in the Newcastle Herald Seniors Week Supplement and they kept coming all afternoon. The roster girls told me that more than 20 new members signed up.

At our committee meeting on Monday 26 March we set the date for our Annual General Meeting as 10 August 2012 and the committee decided that it would be good to have the meeting and lunch afterwards at the East Maitland Bowling Club.

All aspects of the club reported on by the various officers are progressing well. We intend to install a small kitchenette in the lunch room and are progressing this, subject to the necessary approval of the school.

Having set the date for the Annual General Meeting the subject of committee positions for our next year was discussed. It is not that far away. A major consideration is that our constitution provides that the four office bearers of the club, president, vice president, treasurer and secretary, may not hold the position for more than four consecutive years. 


SENIORS WEEK ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS CEREMONY
