DigiPals is an active group of ComputerPals members who meet on the third Monday of each month at 1 p.m. in the Islington clubroom to learn and explore digital photography.




TabPals

The Federal Government's <u>Stay Smart Online website</u> recommends we change our passwords every 3 to 12 months depending on whether the account type has confidential or valuable information.

If you are continually having problems remembering your password perhaps you should consider enrolling in our Password Management Course, commencing <u>Thursday 5th March in Session 2</u>.




