A fine day beckoned on Saturday 7th May as 16 members set off for Sydney and a cruise down the Parramatta River.



After meeting up at Strathfield and a short train trip to Parramatta, we were met by a contingent of the local Computerpals Club along with our own Past President, Elaine Butler, now resident in Sydney.



A bus ride and walk then took us to Elizabeth House/Farm, one of a number of historic sites in the district. A morning coffee and scrumptious scones soon had us ready for a very interesting and informative tour of this establishment.



First built in 1793, the house was modified over 40 years for the controversial John Macarthur and wife Elizabeth, pioneers of the Australian wool industry.

Full of knowledge and accompanied by most of the Parramatta ‘mob’, we then enjoyed an extended walk down to the ferry wharf where we boarded for the hour and a half trip to Circular Quay. The winding route took us firstly through mangrove river banks dwarfed in some places by tall buildings and on through suburbs rarely passed when visiting Sydney by road.

It was soon obvious that many tourists use this service as the river cat ferry soon filled from the dozen or so stops along the way. Unfortunately, a major controlled burn by NSW Fire Authority did not “control” the widespread smoke haze, restricting ideal photographic conditions - very inconsiderate of them! After arriving at The Quay, we bade farewell to our city cousins and made our way back to Central and on home to ‘Newy’.

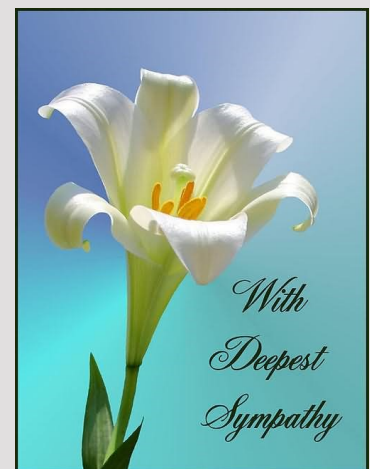

A Interesting Story from Lindsay...

A friend in his eighties who tries to be technically independent uses me as his consultant. We were having our regular consultation over coffee after our Tuesday morning Probus club walk.

Friend: “I have just bought a new computer, Windows 10. I found a driver for my trusted old printer but I cannot get it to work. Any suggestions?”

Me: “Best I come and have a look, these things are pretty hard to solve without looking at what is going on.”

Friend: “I don’t want to put you to any trouble. I have been trying to solve it but if you could come and have a look that would be good.”

Well, I went and looked... Right click on the Start Button, select Control Panel, then Devices and Printers ... yes it was there ... Fuji Xerox. Tried to print from WordPad, no action!

OK, uninstall and see what happens ... Same procedure but this time to Programs and Features, there it is! Right click and Uninstall. Aha! There is a Repair Option, let’s try that. Said it fixed a problem but still no printing action.

Let’s have a look at the Properties of the printer, see if I can find anything there. Aha! There is a Troubleshoot option, let’s try that. Lo and behold, a message!! *“the printer is plugged into a USB 3.0 port, please plug it into a USB 2.0 port”* ...or words to that effect.

To the back of the tower and sure enough there are two USB 3.0 ports just above the two USB 2.0 ports. Moved the cable and “BINGO” only thing left to do, make the Fuji Xerox the default printer and we had out second cup of coffee for the day!



My friend actually knew that there were USB 3.0 and USB 2.0 ports on the back of the computer. Neither he nor I would have expected an incompatibility problem.

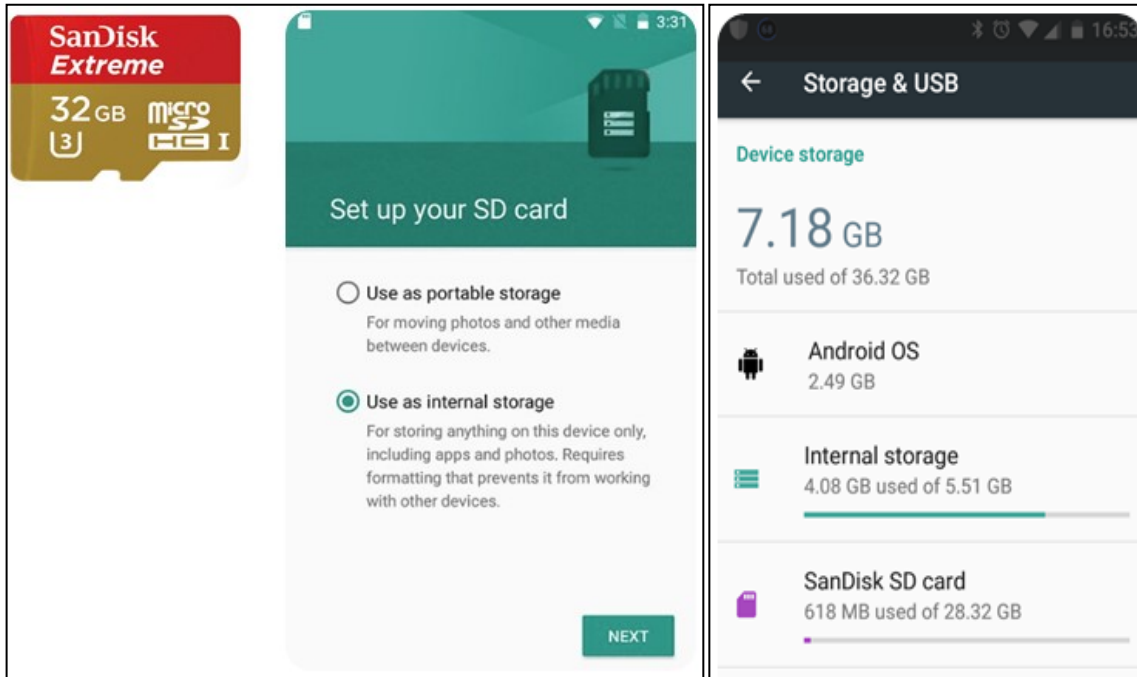

Tech Talk... from President Lindsay

If you have an android phone with 6.0 Marshmallow on it and the capability of adding an SD card you can make that SD Card internal storage rather than portable storage. With version 6.0 Marshmallow when you insert an SD card (Micro SD that is) the system will ask you which you want to use it as, see below. My suggestion is that if you already have an SD card in use do not try to convert it, buy a new one, as big as the phone will support, in my case 32 GB and the highest speed available, I bought a **SanDisk Extreme MicroSDHC 32GB 90MB/s Memory Card**. It cost \$39.00. Instead of having the 8 GB built into the phone almost full I now have the Device storage showing as 7.18 GB total used of 36.32 GB.

Note: The Geeks will tell you that it is possible with earlier version of android but you need tweaking software. It is built into version 6.0 Marshmallow.



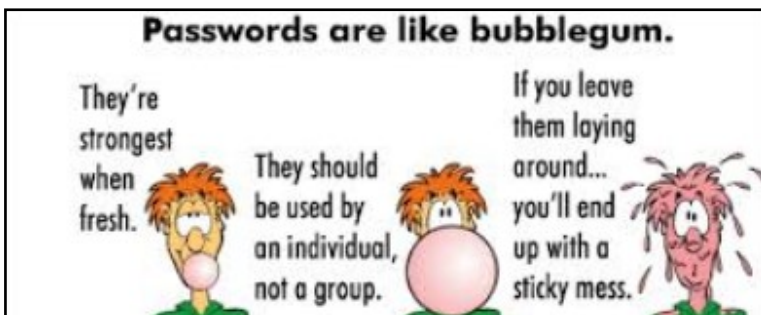
Funnybone ...
