
"No, no, not at all. I stepped off the curb to sniff a poodle's butt and a car hit me"

My best Windows 10 tip.


Click on the Start Button and type.

I should explain. I often receive the comment "I have a new computer and it has Windows 10. It is so different and I don't know where to find anything."

Windows 10 has a wonderful search facility, just click on the Start Button and type what you want to find.

In the example shown I have clicked on the Start Button (bottom left) and typed "backup", I get a Best match of Backup and Restore (Windows 7) and in Settings there is Backup settings. I actually wanted Backup settings so that is not bad.

All you need to do now is click on the preferred result. Try it you will find it most useful.




