Our Top Alerts of 2019 – scams, exploits and data breaches! 27 February 2020

-In these times of great difficulty, and using peoples' fear and need for safety against them, the scammers are working hard.

- ◆ Locally, there have been people wearing what passes as HASMAT outfits and going around houses where they pass themselves off as government workers coming to check that your home is Covid-19 free. They ask for entry so they can check and sanitize for you and once through the door, while one keeps you occupied with questions and information, the other quickly goes through your home, pocketing your treasures. The group I heard about was in Stockton, but by now there could be more and they could be anywhere. They even produce workable identification.
 - DO NOT allow anybody into your home if you don't know them.
- Do you go shopping in those early mornings when more goods should be available? If you do, be very careful when returning to your vehicle. In two incidents I have heard of, the elderly shoppers unlocked their vehicles, and while they took a few seconds to put their handbags in the vehicles, their trolleys and contents were stolen. Be careful and be aware of your surroundings.
- I have had lots of text messages the phone calls seem to have stopped completely - about virus testing. I am asked to tap a link to fill in my details so they can tell me which centre to attend to be tested.
 DO NOT ever give your private details online as it is an ideal opportunity for Identity Theft


Join your local library. You can do it online, the process is very quick and simple to follow, just make sure you write down the member number they give you until you receive your card in the mail. By joining Newcastle Library and Lake Macquarie Library, you have access to every library in the Newcastle area, and thousands of books for zero cost under the same lending rules as physical books. You can renew your loan online as well if you are not going to finish the book by the due date. Keep an eye on your date too, because it can be rather frustrating to find that, with one or two chapters, the book has disappeared. You get no warning. The hours that I spend inside Regrettably there's no place to hide Inside it is, that I must stay Until the Government says OK




There's jobs around, not done for years Painting, weeding and garden shears Thoughts go round and round my head Makes me weary, so I'm off to bed

There's months to go, or so they tell us I'll get through it without much fuss I'll do the same as our great Nation Put myself into hibernation.




