If you've been the victim of a cybercrime including financial loss, report it to **ReportCyber at <u>www.cyber.gov.au/report</u>**.

Keeping yourself safe online is largely a simple matter of Common Sense. Think about this: Would some random person in the street say to you "something's broken in your house. Give me free access and I will fix it for \$???."

Why then would you believe some random person who rings and says "you have a computer problem. Give me access and I will fix it"

SCAM ALERT.... I have had three of these notices in the last week, accompanying a request for a small amount of money for underpaid postage. The amounts requested have been between \$3 and \$5, not a lot - until you multiply it by the number of people who pay and then it adds up to quite a sum.

It's important NOT to give your bank details to anyone.

Of the 3 I received, one was by email and the other two by text. PLEASE BE CAREFUL!

ASCCA has reinstated the Creative Writing Competition for 2021, and the guidelines for the entries are listed below.

I have spoken to the organiser, Susan Jensen, to clarify a thing or two and can tell you that **poetry is not included...** at least not this year, so stories are all that will be judged.

With the English language being so tricky with grammar, similar sounding words, words that are spelled the same but have different meanings, plus many other idiosyncratic foibles, Susan suggested a free program that we may find helpful https://www.grammarly.com This little program is well worth checking out and might be helpful for those of us who sometimes get our words mixed up eg weather, wether or whether etc. There are heaps of these puzzlers out there. Give it a try. It is free.

Creative Writing Competition 2021 — Guidelines

Entries open 2nd August and close at midnight on 16th August 2021.

Send your entry, with your head and shoulders (selfie) photograph and a completed entry form to competitions@ascca.org.au. ASCCA Board members and professional writers are ineligible to enter.

The six categories include enough scope and a broad enough explanation to allow for a range of entrants with a wide range of skills and imagination to confidently enter any category. All entries are to be submitted by the individual writer who is encouraged to present up to three pieces in total; each in a different category, and each of which has a 1000 word limit.

Please use — <u>Font</u>: Times New Roman, <u>Size</u>: 14 point, Lines to be <u>double spaced</u>.

CATEGORIES Up to 3 topics allowed

1 Femininity / Masculinity The essence of being male or female of any age.

2 *Companion Animals Capturing the magical attraction of small furry, hairy, scaled or feathered companions.*

3 Seasons and Weather The delights and excitement of the seasonal or climatic changes in the natural world around you.

4 Dusk to Dawn Strange things that inhabit your dreams.

5 Just Plain Ugly It's in the eye of the beholder.

6 Life Changing Event What was the effect of the event? Please avoid anything to do with a pandemic.

Champion Creative Writers — winners will be selected by judge/s.

40 points for first place, 30 points for second place 20 points for third place, 10 points for highly commended, 1 club point for each topic entered.

Winners will be announced at the ASCCA Conference on 10th November.

Their names, their selfie and entries will be published on the ASCCA website after 10th November 2021.

The list of subject matter for the Photographic Competition gives you a very enticing range of topics to display your creativity. If you have questions, please contact Barry Keen through the Computerpals email or phone number.

Digital Photography Competition 2021 — Guidelines

Entries open 15th September and close at midnight on 30th September 2021.

Send your entry, with your head and shoulders (selfie) photograph and a completed entry form to competitions@ascca.org.au.

ASCCA Board members and professional photographers are ineligible to enter.

The approach this year is on creativity and interpretation of the categories. Photographic technical ability is still important but not more important than the creative interpretation of the subject. Considering both will allow all entrants to show their abilities. The seven categories include enough scope and a broad enough explanation to allow entrants with a wide range of skills and imagination to confidently enter any category. **All entries are to be submitted by the individual photographer who is permitted to present one photograph, to a maximum size of 4MB in each category, taken between 2nd September 2020 and 15th September 2021**.

No post camera manipulation will be permitted — except minor cropping, straightening and exposure adjustments.

CATEGORIES Up to seven photos allowed

1.0 *People* — *Femininity/Masculinity* - More than an image, rather a visual expression (your interpretation) of the essence of being male or female of any age.

2.0 Companionable animals - Filling a void (or finding a place) at any age. Capturing the magical attraction of small furry, hairy, scaled or feathered companions.

3.0 Nature — The Seasons and Weather - The delights and excitement of the seasonal or climatic changes in the natural world around you.

4.0 Night time — **Dusk to Dawn** - Any image captured at night with or without additional artificial lighting.

5.0 The Wild Card — Just Plain Ugly - It's in the eye of the beholder.

6.0 Simplicity - Images which say more with less and/or by powerful composition and/or the use or absence of colour.

7.0 Form in nature - Images that capture naturally created lines, shapes, patterns, or mathematical sequences, etc. in the natural world.

Champion Digital Photographers — winners will be selected by judge/s.

40 points for first place, 30 points for second place 20 points for third place, 10 points for highly commended 1 club point for each photograph entered.

Winners will be announced at the ASCCA Conference on 10th November. Their names, selfies and entries will be published on the ASCCA website after 10th
