#### WARNING AND REMINDER FROM DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

With lockdowns, masks and social distancing the norm over the past two years, rates of other respiratory illness such as influenza and whooping cough have plummeted. But as we open up, medical experts warn that those infections will bounce back with a vengeance.

One concern, though, is these low rates may have lulled us into complacency. It might mean many people haven't been in any rush to get their flu vaccine.

What's more, because very few of us have had these infections over the past two years, we have probably experienced less of a boost in any 'natural' immunity.

We need to be wary of these infections bouncing back, especially as we head into winter and our borders open to international travellers.

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) last week released advice urging all Australians to get a flu vaccine once available, which is likely to be from April.

There's things in life that are hard to explain Be it simple or complex, it's all just the same Why do we do it, or why is it done Is it because we all live under the sun?




